About the Position

The role of cattery cleaner is critical for the wellbeing and happiness of cats, kittens and rabbits living at the shelter. Cleaners are there to assist staff in making sure the living arrangements for cats are pleasant and sanitary. Cattery cleaners are also responsible for the cleaning of rabbit cages.

- Cleaning cages and recreational areas;
- Replenishing water, bedding and toys;
- Handling cats/ kitten and rabbits;
- Laundry Tasks.

Cattery Cleaner – Task Analysis

The role of a cattery cleaner is physically demanding requiring a high degree of lifting, bending, squatting and reaching, including within small spaces. Occupants of these roles are on their feet for the entirety of their shift (generally 2 hours). Occupants must be able to work independently and with minimal supervision.
